DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In January 2020 all three of GOM's ensembles were touring far-flung regions of the world. A month later we had all 34 staff grounded in Australia with very little idea what might happen next. Stripped of our most precious commodity as physical artists – human touch – our disorientation was, like everyone's, very real. The silver lining of course is that we essentially ended up with a funded company for the first time ever.

From this space of silver-lined disorientation, we began an optimistic 14-week process of project development codenamed – There's no I in Quaran-team. 42 creative tasks distributed electronically to 30 artists, returned and distilled (we almost broke Google Drive) into potent departure points for creating new work with absolutely no guarantee of a future.

Enter Adelaide, Sydney and Darwin festivals and the MFI (Major Festival Initiative) who, through a great deal of hard work, got this behemoth of a work funded. This is me clocking our privilege and saying a big fat thank you to everyone who helped birth this beast.

The complexity of the process that lead us to the finished work is, in many ways, reflected in the work itself.

At its heart, *The Pulse* is a story of cause and effect. It aims to enlarge the importance of human touch and connection and act as some kind of lens through which to stare at the world and appreciate its scale from both a cellular and celestial viewpoint.

I hope you enjoy The Pulse.

AURORA is the senior vocal ensemble of internationally renowned South Australian youth choir Young Adelaide Voices, under the direction of Christie Anderson.

A diverse and talented ensemble, Aurora performs a range of repertoire from early music to contemporary pop and they are committed to performing contemporary Australian music.

Aurora have sung everywhere from onstage with the Rolling Stones at the Adelaide Oval to the orchestral pit for the Australian Ballet's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

In 2020 Aurora recorded the vocal tracks for Netanela Mizrahi and Guwanbal Gurruwiwi's *Djari Project*, which won an Australian Art Music Award, and they were involved in two creative developments with acrobatic sensations Gravity and Other Myths, making *The Pulse*, which they premiered at the 2021 Adelaide Festival.
