Since Guy Sebastian exploded into our hearts as winner of the inaugural *Australian Idol* in 2003, he has been the only male solo artist to boast six #1 singles and three #1 albums in ARIA chart history. 



A bold and intimate exploration of contemporary South Asian identity

Be entirely enveloped in the vivid and sometimes surreal world of acclaimed filmmaker and video artist Naina Sen's large-scale, conceptual video works.
