Introduction

How the Bird Got Their Colours is an Indigenous-led performance blending traditional First Nations dance, storytelling and contemporary circus in a visually stunning outdoor spectacle.

It is suitable for all ages.

The performance takes place outside at the Museum and Art Gallery of the NT (MAGNT) Amphitheatre.

To attend, you need to purchase a ticket.

Arrival

Entrance

Tickets

There will be Darwin Festival staff as you enter the Monsoon Garden who will scan your ticket.

Toilets

Inside the Monsoon Garden

Amphitheatre

The performance

When you enter, you will see it set up ready for the performance.

When the performance begins, the performers will enter the stage and the audience will go quiet.

During the performance, there will be music, singing and talking, which may be a little loud.

The performers will pretend to be different characters and wear costumes like the ones they are wearing in the photograph above.

The performers will also perform circus tricks, which may mean they stand on top of each other and perform backflips.

At the end of the performance the performers will take a bow and the audience will clap.
